Marian's NAAC Success Story

A Milestone for Quality Education

I am really thrilled to share this fantastic news with all my dear Marian Alumni members. Our Alma Mater has recently achieved an outstanding success in NAAC accreditation (Cycle 4) with a high grade of A++ with a score of 3.71/4. This high score has placed us among the top - performing institutions in the country. It validates our commitment to excellence and definitely underlines the significant contributions of our Management, Faculty, Students and Alumni. We strongly believe that the unwavering support of Marian Alumni Association also has played a crucial role in accomplishing this feat.

The NAAC accreditation process involved a rigorous evaluation of various aspects of our institution including teaching, learning, examinations, infrastructure, facilities, governance, student support services etc. the process had been very challenging and our Marian Community rose to the occasion to deliver excellent results. As you all know, we tirelessly strive to provide a conducive environment that fosters academic excellence aiming at the holistic

development of our students.

We were able to achieve 100% syllabus revision in all programs after getting autonomy. The syllabus revision resulted in 97% of courses offered in the institution leading to skill enhancement or employability. Associations with industrial partners like TCS, ACCA etc. ensured industry relevant curriculum. We were able to offer 131 value addition certificate courses for skill enhancement.

The implementation of Information and Communication Technology enabled Outcome Based Education curriculum was another milestone in this accreditation. It helped us to develop our best practice and also to score 3.74 in criterion II. We were also able to offer Consultancy Services to other institutions in this area raising an amount of rupees 32 lakhs. During this assessment period the campus has been transformed into a beautiful learning centre with round the clock ICT facilities, new auditorium complex, modern studio etc. The support from our Alumni in restructuring our curriculum, enhancing our placement and the philanthropic activities under its welfare wing helped as to score high marks in criterion V.

As you may know, our chapter aims to increase the engagement of our alumni in and around Chennai, including those in Pondicherry. We want to create more awareness and opportunities for our network.


Recently, we had a mini-meet-up with Nelson and Jesbin, we discussed some ideas and plans to develop our chapter. One of them is
