
As the chairperson, I am proud of what this team have accomplished together and I am honored to contribute to creating a solid base that will motivate Marianites to enhance their professional network.



## Key Insights from K Thomas, WHO

10 Questions with the Project Management Officer

& an alumni of Marian's BCom first batch (1995 - 98)

Q. To start, could you tell us a little about your background, including where you grew up and your family? Where are you settled now?

I am from a very remote village called Kothapara near Upputhara, Idukki. During my studies there were no electricity or other basic amenities or transport facilities. I did some menial jobs during my studies. With great support and sacrifice from my family, I did pursue my studies and immediately after securing graduation I joined with my sisters who were in Delhi. They supported me to start my journey in Delhi which lasted for long 24 years. I worked with different organizations in Delhi and Joined WHO India Country Office in 2012. My wife is a nurse, and we have three children. Last year we moved to Geneva, Switzerland as I got selected for a position at WHO Headquarters.

## Q. How do you think your background and experience have influenced your work and approach within the WHO?

Most of my career, I worked with organizations not for profit, that helped me to broaden my perspective in managing public finance. Also, the extensive experiences with auditors helped me to focus on compliance, quality assurance, setting up internal controls etc. Being agile to change made me to be



open for diverse opportunities and tested my capabilities at different roles. Such experiences and expertise helped me to bring efficiencies within the organization and to contribute towards my career progression.

## Q. What skills and qualities do you believe have contributed most to your success in your current role as project Manager with WHO?

Being in emergency response, coordination with stakeholders dispersed globally at different time zones, many working remotely or at the emergency frontlines is important. So, effective project management with timely planning, executing, monitoring, and reporting is my key function, and that makes my life easier.

Teamwork is another important aspect given the complexity of issues, especially in managing emergency response projects. I do engage and encourage meaningful collaboration to bring valuable skills and experiences from each person involved. Even in very difficult and complex situations, the magic happens when we join together proactively with active listening towards consensus-building, focusing on the outcome or expected result.

Being neutral and unbiased is very important when working in a UN Agency. But working in a multicultural environment is not that easy. Despite all best efforts, there are chances that I may give-in to unconscious bias due to my upbringing, thoughts, beliefs, and convictions. Every day I do reflect on my plans, actions, thoughts, and feelings to unpack my unconscious bias to ensure respect and to promote individual and cultural differences.

Another skill that I consider as key is communication. Whether engaging with co-workers/ stakeholders on the other side of the world or explaining a complicated topic, being articulate is important. Given the diverse nature of personnel involved in an emergency response, I do engage with simple

easy to understand and straight-forward communications, using appropriate medium/tools, keeping in mind who is the audience as many of them may not be a subject expert.

Outcomes and results are what finally counts, so I do ensure results in expected lines with effective use of available resources. Risk management is another area, where I do invest to anticipate risks to effectively mitigate negative impacts or to capitalize on emerging opportunities.

## Q. In what ways has working with the WHO has helped you grow personally and professionally?

"WHO's work is about serving people, about serving humanity. Most importantly, it's about fighting to ensure the health of people is a basic human right." - Dr Tedros, DG WHO.

WHO's work is founded on the principle that all people, everywhere, should enjoy the highest standard of health. It's a great platform to work as an international civil servant with talented professionals, who contribute to this important mission. At any one time, the WHO workforce is actively responding to dozens of infectious disease outbreaks and natural disasters around the world. It is fulfilling to play a role in this important mission in supporting the countries



to recover from emergencies with public health consequences. The Organization offered a dynamic work environment, opportunities for professional development. Working with this Organization helped me to have broad perspectives, ideas, and experiences as integrated with a diverse, multicultural and gender balanced workforce. The learning and development opportunities supported and encouraged my growth at all stages in my career with WHO. Trainings, tools, and other development opportunities helped me to optimize my potential, for both my personal benefit and to contribute to the Organization.

## Q. How has your journey shaped your perspective on failure and setbacks? How do you approach them now?

"Success is stumbling from failure to failure with no loss of enthusiasm." — Winston Churchill

It was not easy for me to put failures and setbacks in right perspective in the youthful ages. I was striving for success at every attempt but resulted in much disappointment most of the time. This made me a safe player and sedentary for few years with pessimistic outlook, resulting into a stagnation with depressive thoughts. But with strong relationships and networks, slowly I understood that unless I try and fail there is no chance for success and success is not instantaneous, especially given my background and constraints. Outcome of every attempt is a learning whether it's a success or failure and those learnings helps me to shape up my resilience and that positively influence work satisfaction and the urge to bounce back with much enthusiasm and energy. I do nurture and build my resilience through a wide variety of interactions with people in my personal and professional lives. Some of them do become real mentors and help to crystalize the meaningful purpose or help to see a path forward to overcome a setback. When I positively react to a failure or a setback, it improves my adversity quotient and prepares to confront greater challenges.

## Q. Can you tell us something about your days at Marian? Tell us something about your batchmates?

My first (unsuccessful) formal job interview was in 1995 for a clerical or attender post in Marian, basing my Pre-Degree qualification. As my pre-degree scores were not great, it was not expected that I may get an admission in Marian for studies, and so I was reluctant to apply. But my brother insisted to apply and followed through and eventually I could join this great institution as a first batch B.Com student, which helped me to shape my future. I remain grateful to Marian and to my teachers, non-teaching staff and the management of Marian. With my poor English skills and great distractions, I struggled during my studies, but finally passed out with a decent score, thanks to my teachers (Jojo sir, Thomas sir, Sabu Sir, Florence miss, Marykutty miss, Chackochan sir and Raju Sir). Those wonderful days at Marian will be cherished forever.

We were a great batch, and our classmates are still thick friends. When we completed our course, there were no social media or other advanced communication tools, but we kept our connections. Even after 25 years, we do cherish our days in Marian and keeping virtual connections though we are in different geographical locations. Sadly, two of our batchmates left us to their permanent abode.


## **Education is the Way...**






## A Walk to Remember: Roots 2k14
