HOW TO APPLY?

- Applications shall be submitted online through the College website.
- Applications for Management quota also shall be submitted online. However, a hard copy of the application (print out of the online application) shall be submitted to the College office.
- Fee for application form is ₹ 500/- (₹ 200/- for SC/ST candidates).

- Fee shall be remitted through payment gateways provided in the College website.
- Application fee once remitted will not be refunded.
- Candidates awaiting results of qualifying examinations are also eligible to apply.

Relaxation in Marks in the qualifying examination:

Kerala Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe Category: The minimum requirement for admission to PG programmes is a pass in the qualifying examination for the Kerala Scheduled caste /Scheduled tribe categories.

SEBC Category: A relaxation of 3% marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed (See Annexure I (d)) i.e. CGPA of 1.88 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.7 for CBCSS (2013/2017), applicants and 47% marks for pre-CBCSS applicants for admission to M Sc programmes and CGPA of 1.68 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.2 for CBCSS (2013/2017) applicants and 42% marks for pre-CBCSS applicants for admission to M.A/M.Com programmes.

OEC Category: A relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed (See Annexure I (c) i.e. CGPA of 1.80 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.5 for CBCSS (2013/2017) applicants and 45% marks for pre - CBCSS applicants for admission to M Sc programmes and CGPA of 1.60 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.0 for CBCSS (2013/2017) applicants and 40% marks for pre CBCSS applicants for admission to MA/M Com programmes.

Persons with Disability (Divyangjan) category: A relaxation of 5% marks in the qualifying examination from the prescribed minimum is allowed i.e. CGPA of 1.80 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.5 for CBCSS (2013/2017) applicants and 45% marks for pre - CBCSS applicants for admission to M Sc programmes and CGPA of 1.60 for CBCSS (2009), CCPA of 4.0 for CBCSS (2013/2017) applicants and 40% marks for pre CBCSS applicants for admission to MA/M Com programme.

- Claims for mandatory reservations shall be made at the time of submission of application with supporting documents as required.
- The claims for mandatory reservations once made in the application form cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.
- There is no age limit for applying to various PG programmes.
- Academic eligibility shall be satisfied as on the last date for submission of academic data.
- If an applicant is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later, admission will be denied or he/she will be expelled from the College.

BONUS MARKS / DEDUCTION OF MARKS

Bonus Marks: - The Bonus marks will be awarded as follows:

- a. Bonus marks of 10 will be awarded to 'B' and 'C' Certificate holders of NCC in proof of their high proficiency. The bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of the NCC certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate provided the candidates have secured at least 75% attendance after having participated in NCC activities during the period of study for Undergraduate programmes.
- b. Bonus marks of 5 will be awarded to NSS certificate holders. The bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS certificates signed by the Vice-Chancellor or the Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the University and issued to volunteers who have completed 240 hours of work within a period of 2 years of undergraduate study immediately preceding the P.G programmes for which admission is sought.
- c. The claim of candidates who have participated in NCC/NSS activities prior to the University level programme i.e. Higher Secondary / Plus Two / Vocational Higher Secondary etc. will not be taken into account for awarding bonus marks.
- d. The benefit of bonus marks can be scored by a candidate only under one category, ie, for either NSS or NCC.
- e. A bonus marks of 15 will be awarded to the Ex-servicemen /widows and children of Ex-service men seeking admission to the P.G. Programmes. Applicants in this category shall invariably produce the certificate in support of their claim at the time of admission. The certificate shall be obtained not earlier than six months from the last date of submission of application from the military authorities or State/Zilla Sainik Welfare Officer to the effect that the applicant is an ex-service man himself/herself/ the son/daughter of ex-service man.
- f. Bonus marks will be added only if the candidate has obtained the minimum qualifying marks prescribed by the College in the qualifying examination while calculating the index marks.

Deduction of Marks: - Deduction will be made from the total ranking marks for those candidates who had availed more than one chance in passing the qualifying examination as detailed below:

- a. Handicap mark of 5 will be deducted from the total rank marks for each additional appearance he/she has taken for completing the qualifying examination. Number of chances means the number of chances for passing any part of the qualifying examination excluding cancellation. In the case of grades where marks range is given, the mid value will be taken for computation of index marks.

*SELECTION PROCEDURE

MA in Hospitality and Tourism Management (MHTM)

Selection of the students is made on the basis of the rank list prepared as per existing rules of reservation by the state. The merit mark will be the cumulative score of any one of the national level management entrance examinations like MAT, CAT, CMAT/state level management entrance examination (KMAT) and personal interview.

For the purpose of preparation of final rank list, the total marks will be calculated out of 150. The breakup of marks shall be:

- Entrance Test – 75 Marks
- Personal Interview – 75 Marks.

For applicants without a valid score from a national level management entrance examination, the College may conduct an entrance test in the similar pattern.

Master of Commerce (M Com)

Index marks will be calculated on the basis of Core Course Marks/CCPA which will be converted to 1000. In case of a grading system, the index marks based on total Grade Point of Core Courses will be calculated using appropriate conversion formula.

Master of Social Work (MSW)

Aptitude and suitability of the candidates are assessed on the basis of Aptitude test, Group Discussion and Personal Interview.

Merit list will be prepared based on the following criteria.

1. **Aptitude Test:** (50 Marks) There will an aptitude test conducted by the School of Social Work consisting of objective type questions to check the aptitude for social work profession, verbal ability, reasoning, language proficiency in English and General Knowledge.
2. **Group Discussion (GD):** (50 Marks) Shortlisted candidates will be called for a Group Discussion. Theme for the GD will be given on the spot.
3. **Personal Interview:** (50 Marks) Students who attend GD will also be invited for a personal interview.

MA in Communication and Media Studies (MCMS)

Selection is made on the basis of merit list prepared and published.

The merit marks will be the cumulative score of the following:

1. **Entrance Examination:** Candidates will be called for an entrance examination conducted by the Department. Maximum marks for the test will be 50.

2. **Personal Interview:** The shortlisted candidates will be called for a Personal Interview. Maximum marks for Personal Interview will be 50.
3. Rank list will be prepared based on the scores obtained in the Entrance Examination and Personal Interview: out of 100 marks.

Master of Computer Applications (MCA)

- Seats are filled based on the mark of the qualifying examination and personal interview.
- The breakup of marks shall be:
 1. Marks of the qualifying examination: 50 marks
 2. Personal Interview: 50 marks
- Students should be in the rank list published by LBS

Reservations of seats, will be as per Government and University norms.

Master of Business Administration (MBA)

Selection of the students is made based on the rank list prepared as per existing rules of reservation by the state. The merit marks will be the cumulative score of any one of the national-level management entrance examinations (80 marks), group discussion (10 marks) and personal interview (10 marks). Due consideration will also be given to the academic performance in the undergraduate programme.
