Meet Arya Prakash...

An accomplished alumna of Marian College who graduated in 2020 with a degree in MCMS (Media and Communications). Arya has established herself as a dubbing artist, lending her voice to over 25 films. Her journey in the field of dubbing has been both fulfilling and enriching. Arya, a proud Marian College alumna, recently completed her work on the movie "Praavu," which has garnered significant acclaim, celebrating 25 days of successful screenings. Let's hear from Arya and her experiences, insights, in the dubbing world.

Can you tell us about your journey from being a media and communications student at our college to becoming a dubbing artist for the successful movie "Praavu"?

I pursued my Master's in Communications and Media Studies from Marian College in the year 2018-2020. This course helped me acquire so much knowledge in various fields, especially Radio Marian, our own college radio was the first step for me as an RJ. The RJ works helped me gain confidence and eventually an internship with Red FM. During this internship I got a chance to dub for an advertisement, and this landed me an opportunity as a dubbing artist. It was a journey of beautiful learning I must say.



What specific skills or knowledge gained during your time at the college do you think were instrumental in your success as a dubbing artist?

Honestly, our college helped me way more than I could ever have imagined. Anyone, including me, when you first hear Media and Communications would naturally think of papers, News channels and alike. But the various fields that come under this forte are unimaginable. Being introduced to Radio Jockeying and training myself in college helped me curb my fear of the mic, this training helped me use my voice fearlessly in front of the mic anywhere. The faculty members have also certainly helped me with content and voice modulation, and I owe my experience with Radio Marian to what I have achieved in my career.

Praavu" completed 25 days of successful screenings. How do you feel about being part of a project that achieved such a milestone?

In short, it is God's blessing! Praavu is my fourth work as a dubbing artist, this movie is the directorial debut of Navaz Ali which has

many new faces as cast. This story of the movie is based on one of Padma Rajan sir's stories and was released only in specific theatres in Kerala to receive very good appreciation from the viewers and I am very happy about that. In this movie, I am dubbing for the heroine Yami Sona. Praavu will soon be released on some OTT platforms as well.



Can you share some insights into the role of a dubbing artist and the challenges you faced while working on "Praavu"?

One of the challenges I faced was Malayalam slang. The artist is from Thrissur so getting used to the dialogues and their timings was a little challenging for me. Nonetheless, a bit of practice and support from everyone helped me through this one-day dubbing.

How did you come across the opportunity to work as a dubbing artist for this movie?

My various works with Red FM, Club FM and

the space I got to grow gave me this chance. I was not very familiar with the dubbing field but my work as an RJ and the advertisement for which I had lent my voice were the only references I gave to a few contacts. That is how I met a senior dubbing artist Vishalam ma'am, I went to one of the studios where I had my voice test done through which I got this opportunity.

What motivated you to choose a career in dubbing, and how did you discover your passion for this aspect of the media industry?

All my previous work in college, my internship with Red FM and Club FM made me realise how voice can be used best to make a career out of it. Through the years I realised how talented so many people are in Kerala, to be able to make films, short films, and advertisements as well as how important voice is in them. Dubbing as a career came to me, it





was just the timing that helped the people from the industry recognize the potential in my voice. Also, it is not a mere 9 - 5 job, you have the freedom to work at your convenience and that is the best of it all.

Any future projects you are working on?

I have dubbed about 25 films of which 7 are for lead artists and rest are supporting artist voices. There are a few in line for release - DNA directed by T.S. Suresh Babu, Kuruvipappa directed by Joshy John and Pathimoonam Rathri directed by Maneesh Babu.

A message to all those who wish to follow your career path.

Embrace every opportunity to learn and explore different aspects of media. Building a versatile skill set is crucial in this dynamic industry. Networking and fostering connections can open unexpected doors.. Cherish the journey, learn from experiences, and always be open to new challenges – they often lead to the most rewarding opportunities.





During the pandemic, like everybody else we were stuck and that's when Jose initiated his usual research, stumbling upon the idea of cycle rides.

He bought a normal bicycle first, integrated a shifter and started riding. He kept me updated about the vibe and the feel he got through riding. I really got convinced when I heard that he bought a new mountain bike. 

'Do Anything for You' - That is Dafy - Dafy extends driver assistance services to a broad audience, with a primary mission of preventing instances of drunk driving. Our Dafy drivers go beyond traditional chauffeurs; they function as personal assistants, comprising well-trained professionals capable of offering more than just driving services. Among the key services Dafy presently provides are pickups from bars and clubs, hospital assistance, outstation

rides, and rides within the city.

The idea of DAFY first budded in my mind during my Bcom 4th semester. The business plan was generated by me and my best friends with the intention of presenting it at a startup event organised in our college. Unfortunately we couldn't participate in the event. After completing BCom, the onset of the COVID lockdown left us with idle time and our ideas stagnant. As the lockdown lifted and life returned to its old rhythm, this plan resurfaced in my thoughts. In 2021, four of my close friends joined with me to breathe life into this plan. Thus, the entrepreneurial vision we once dreamed of as students has become a reality.

The initial stage presented formidable challenges, as our business grappled with minimal revenue generation, making survival challenging in the absence of profits. As the primary contributor of capital, I found myself



financially drained at this stage. Despite these hurdles, this phase remains a highlight in my life, imparting valuable lessons on the significance of perseverance, optimism, and self-belief. Additionally, it offered the brotherhood of collaborating with college mates, adding enjoyment and excitement at our workplace. Nearly 50% of the boys from our class were, at one point, integral members of Dafy.

After a year and a half of relentless struggle, we gradually gained a foothold in the market, gaining a deeper understanding of its dynamics.

Acknowledging our shortcomings, we implemented substantial changes to our business, resulting in the present business model of Dafy.

Presently, Dafy has successfully accomplished 10,000 rides in Kochi and is gearing up for expansion into Kottayam.



He is not only a successful entrepreneur, but also a generous alum and a skilled networker. He always strives to create meaningful relationships and to contribute to the society with his innovative ideas and solutions. His passion and motivation are evident in his work and his achievements.

Hello Aji, your journey from being the first batch of Marian College in the early 2000s to being a successful serial entrepreneur is truly inspiring. Can you tell us briefly about your background and your businesses?

Thank you!

I belong to the first batch of Marian College (1995 - 1998) and studied BCA.

Later I took my MCA and worked in the IT Industry for 15 years and the last 6 years I am into business. I have founded and run Indus Optics® (Optical Retail Chain), Malgudi Arts™ (Art & craft retail / Gift Shop) and operate a Bata Franchisee.

Can you share some interesting insights into your Marian days and what is the one thing you consider unique about Marian?



It was the most interesting part of my student life and I am in touch with almost all of my Marian friends and teachers. They were supportive at that time as well as these days too.

The unique thing about Marian is its ability to transform normal people to extraordinary professionals.

What motivated you to become an entrepreneur and what made you select physical Retail business rather than IT (Your 15 years expertise was in fact in IT)?
