

Joseph's Everest Base Camp Expedition

In a tale of grit and camaraderie, Ajo Thampi and Paulson Joseph, both distinguished alumni of Marian MCA (2002 - 2005), spearheaded an awe-inspiring adventure to the Everest Base Camp, accompanied by four other intrepid

Camp, accompanied by four other intrepid friends. This article unfolds the narrative of their extraordinary journey through the towering Himalayas.

The idea came from an alumni meet

The inception of the Everest Base Camp Expedition was inspired during an alumni gathering. It was at this reunion that the seed of the idea was planted, igniting a shared passion among the attendees. Ajo Thampi, leveraging connections, obtained valuable travel information from an acquaintance

involved in another trekking venture. Building upon this foundation, Palson took the initiative, turning the idea into a tangible expedition that would soon become a remarkable journey of adventure and camaraderie

Arriving in Kathmandu

On the 19th of November 2023, Paulson and four companions from the United States touched down at Kathmandu airport. Ajo Thampi promptly joined the group at the airport, and together they proceeded to their accommodation at a local hotel.

The arrival in Kathmandu unfolded as a unique experience in its own right. The journey from the airport to the hotel was a fascinating exploration of the vibrant chaos that defines

this bustling city. The juxtaposition of its busyness against the backdrop of traditional charm left a lasting impression.

Flying to Lukla

Team flew from Kathmandu to Lukla to begin our trek. Lukla airport is considered the most dangerous and extreme in the world, and we could see why! The flight in a small plane was nerve-wracking, with the pilots skillfully avoiding mountains. The airstrip was like a long driveway, and we were relieved to land safely. Started walking with their guidance. After months of anticipation, the team was excited to start, although the entire trek ahead made them nervous.

Lukla to Everest base Camp

The journey from Lukla to Everest Base Camp spanned nine days, covering an average of 5 kilometers daily. Each day, we rested at camps along the route, adhering to a 15-kilogram luggage limit. The challenge of high altitude became apparent, with Everest Base Camp registering a chilling temperature of -15 degrees Celsius. Given the altitude, the risk of sickness was significant, and in such cases, airlifting was the sole option.

To ensure the well-being of travelers, three porters accompanied each individual throughout the trek. Their assistance was invaluable, especially considering the potential health challenges associated with the altitude. Despite the physical demands and the harsh conditions, reaching Everest Base Camp was a testament to both endurance and the support network that accompanied each traveler.



Distance, number of days and expenses

The entire journey from Lukla to Everest Base Camp covered a distance of 58 kilometers, taking a total of 14 days to complete. Throughout the trip, basic vegetarian meals were provided at the camp centers. The approximate cost for an individual's expenses during the entire expedition amounted to around 65,000, encompassing various aspects of the journey.

It's worth noting that there is no mobile coverage along the route, adding an element of isolation to the adventure. However, wifi facilities were available at the camping locations, offering a means of communication and connectivity during the trek.

Returning Down to Kathmandu

The trek back down the mountain was quick as it was easier to breathe. All looking forward to getting back to Lukla and contacting home, we were also looking forward to washing our hair! Everyone enjoyed looking around on the way down; As you walk down, it is the same route you came up, you wonder how you managed to get up some parts. It seemed bizarre that I got up some parts of the trail on the way up but at the time pure motivation made it possible. Everyone was so much less stressed about achieving my goal on the way down. The last day of trekking is mostly uphill to Lukla. It rained and was difficult to the finish line, it was poignant, a final reminder of what we went through to reach our goal. Team arrived at our final lodge for one more night as we would fly back to Kathmandu the next morning.



Recalling Marian...

While looking back at my 'good old days' in Marian I want to precisely call the above, the days of 'Formation and Transformation'. This is applicable not only in my case but also in the case of the majority of my students who were with me during my comparatively short term tenure at Marian...

A hard-core 'pedagogue ' transforming into 'HOD PAPPA'. Many of my students from their conventional style into self - confident 'BUDDING MANAGERS

My first and foremost task was to introduce and establish 'BBA', something which had been totally alien to the then educational scenario of Kerala

With a Master's degree in Business Administration and a few years of experience in the training field in a few prestigious institutions like EDII, Ahmedabad (Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India), I felt the task, though a bit challenging, was more or less in tune with my passion.

The first thing was creating a right mindset among the students who were used to conventional methods of learning only.

A future Manager has to be confident in the use of English language. So that was my first priority. Our first Principal Rev. Dr Philips Wadakkekkalam gave me ample support. At least in the initial two or three batches I never used to utter a single word in Malayalam during my lectures. It went up to the extent of complaints to my nephew a third batch BCA student, "Tell your Uncle that we are hard - core Malayalees...".

I tried to introduce the same methodology of training which I had imbibed from the School of Management studies. CUSAT for my MBA. Lecture classes were substituted by Seminars and Discussions. Moreover an unfortunate incident that happened in the first month itself in the College gave me the realisation that students need something more than mere finishing the syllabus. I understood their emotional issues had also to be attended with top priority. So I believe, there itself I started giving practical advices from the real life. At least the initial batches welcomed it whole heartedly. So that turned to be a regular practice till my last day in Marian. Even now I am getting good feedbacks from my old students.



So the University results of the first batch... (1995-98). It was really amazing.. Highest pass percentage with four University ranks. We bagged the very first rank of the University followed by third, fourth and sixth ranks. These rank holders are enjoying a very good position in life, I understand ...

I was a strict disciplinarian too... But my students of the first batch at the time of their farewell acknowledged to me that my style should be continued for the future batches coming as they have benefited a lot out of it.

You all know every day is preceded by night only. The year 2000 was a big trial period for me on the campus. To add fuel to the fire I lost my beloved mother also in the early 2000. So naturally from the same year there was a slight reduction in my overall vigour and enthusiasm. I became closer to God which made me a regular church goer..

Still there was no shift in my style till the year 2007. My interaction with the 2007 passed out batch was a really an eye-opener to me. I became more casual in my approach with the students after that batch. Our Cine Artist Asif Ali was a student of the same batch. His acknowledgement towards me in Malayala Manorama daily on Teacher's day of 2014, I believe was much more than any official awards.. For the first time in life I felt I was a successful teacher.

My elder son Jude joined a seminary for his priestly studies in 2011. His exit created a big vacuum in my life initially. But God really strengthened me through nice promptings in my heart. I got the realization from the Almighty that though he had separated my son from me for his service temporarily he had left with me so many children as my students. There was a sea change in my whole outlook of life... I started viewing every student especially the boys in the place of my son.


Moreover with Fr James Kozhimala's coming to the campus took me to a different plane. I became an effective preacher under the guidance of Fr James on and off the Campus. I started lending my ears to students who were undergoing emotional stress. So during the last few years in Marian God has used me as an effective preacher and counselor.

While turning the pages back, I realized how a few students got hurt because of my strict disciplinarian attitude. But what was amazing was that the majority of the students with whom I had been strict apparently, later acknowledged to me that they have benefited a lot. I now understand that the so-called 'uzhappans' uphold a lot more sense of gratitude than the so called 'padippists'...

Before winding up, I would like to state that though I did not excel high career wise in Marian, I had undergone the transformation in to comparatively better human being. I could not attain a Doctorate or such credentials in my career, but I have the treasure of the love and affection of many of my past students, at least a few who regard me next to their parents. I have also my loving colleagues Mr Joshy, Ms Melby and Mr Arun. Here Ms Melby was the student of my fourth batch who still extends me a helping hand any time.

Yes... that is just wonderful...
