#### **School of Social Work**

The School of Social Work (SSW) has taken initiative for signing academic MoU with 2 institutions in Nepal, St. Xaviers College Kathmandu & Kadambari Memorial College, Nepal in the month of September 2022. Three of the faculty members visited Nepal and took sessions for the students in both the colleges. They have received a financial support of 1.25 Lakh from the UGC STRIDE project of MG University for organising FDP and served as the coordinator for the 7 Days FDP on Outcome Based Social Work Education: From Social Work Competence Framework. The School of Social Work has coordinated the training and survey process of ASER (Annual Status of Education Report) in Idukki District and raised an amount of 91,470 as consultancy amount. Four Faculty Members attended international conferences and delivered guest lectures in Nepal.

Naipunya" Life-Skill based project for children of the tribal area of Kovilmala is implemented in association with Peermade Development Society with support from Karl Kubel Foundation. Two Summer camp for students from nearby communities were organised in collaboration with Extension Department and more than 110 students participated in the camps.

Two of our MSW students are selected for International Field Practicum at Germany as part of our international tie-up with Catholic University of Applied Science, Cologne, Germany.

Consultancy services are offered to NHM Kozhikkode, WCD Idukki, Block Panchayat Azhutha, and Prison Department, Govt of Kerala. Two PG Diploma programmes in the area of Geriatric Care and Counselling and Psychotherapy are running successfully. The School of

Social Work won the overall championship in the DENOVA international conference and student meet organised by DIST, Angamaly. Also got an award as best cheerful college and Akshara M. M of II MSW won best social worker award in the same conference. Nine Students of social work attended the international conferences held in Nepal and Malaysia.

#### **Department of Physics**

- Dr. Jincemon Cyriac and Dr. Midhun H, faculties published five book chapters in edited books by international publishers.
- Dr. Jincemon Cyriac, faculty got first prize in a poster presentation in 35th Kerala Science Congress. Dr. Jincemon Cyriac also got the best dissertation award (NASC – Doctoral dissertation award) in 2022.

Now, about 64 scholars in 6 batches are pursuing their research studies at the Center. Prof. Jose James, former Registrar, Mahatma Gandhi University as the Director coordinates the activities at the center.
