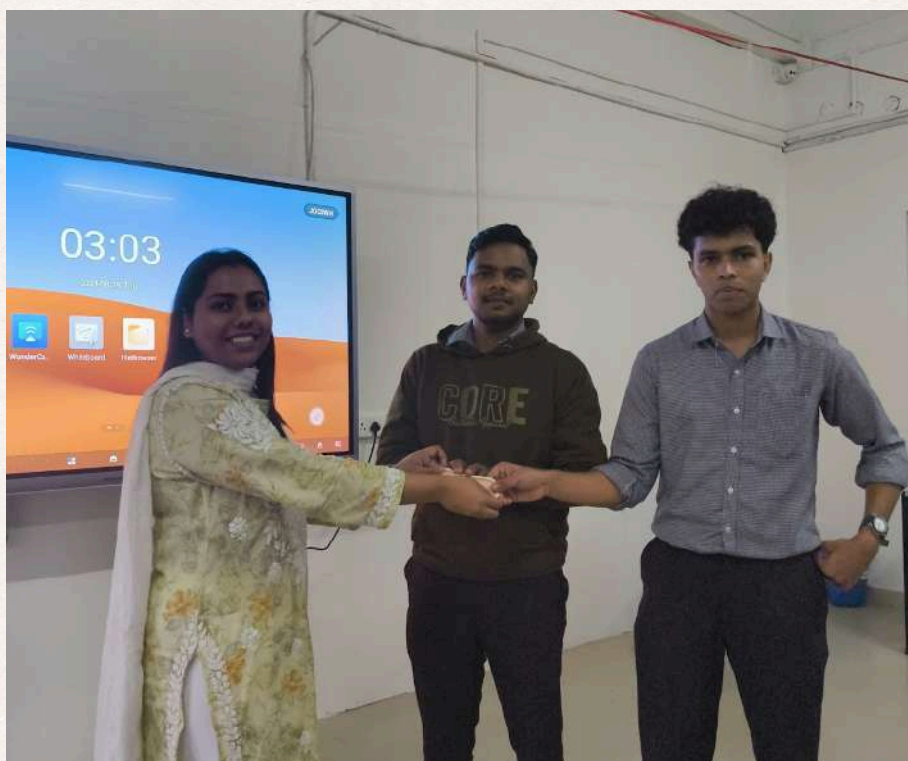
MARIAN SHARK TANK EVENT: I MCOM A

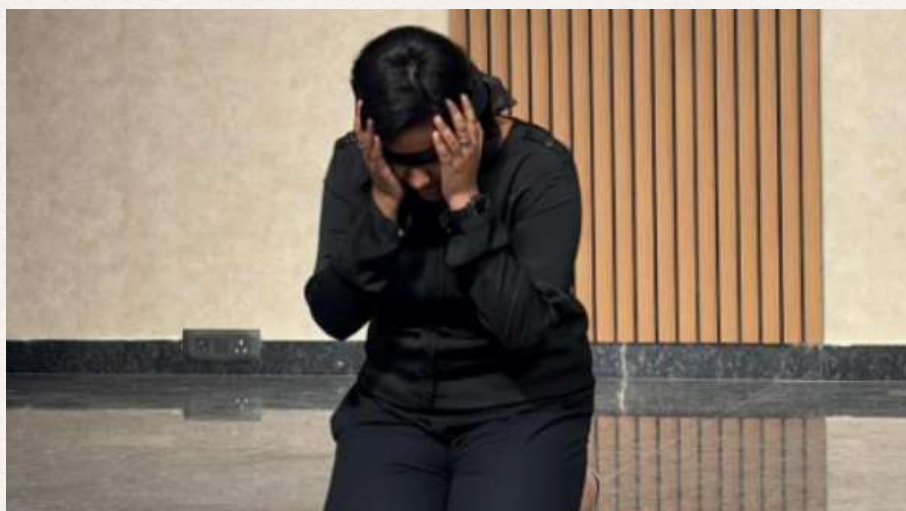
FOSTERING DIALOGUE: DEBATE CLUB
